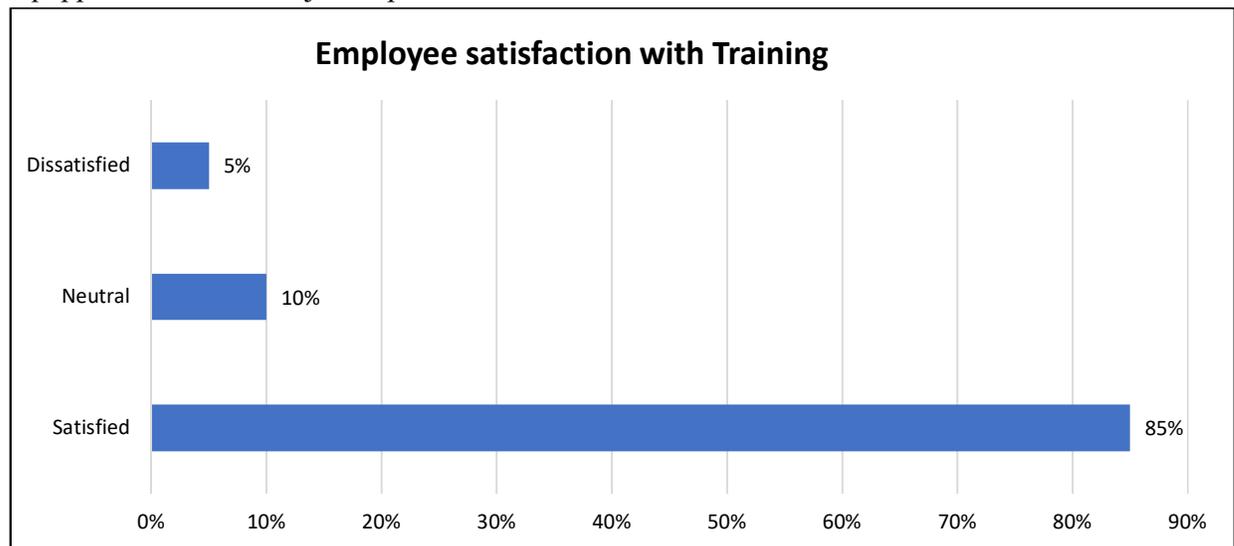

## RESULTS AND DISCUSSION

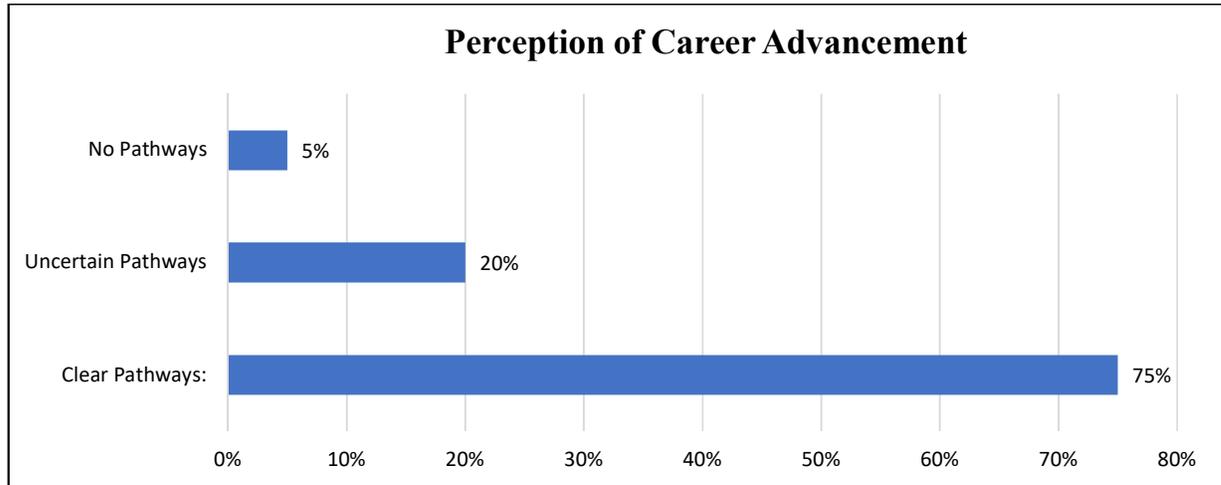

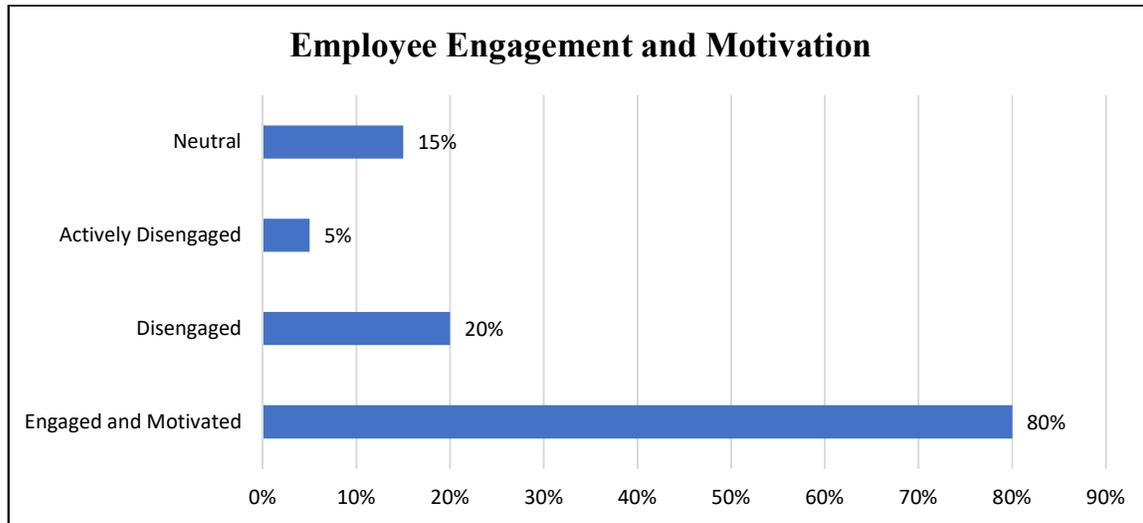
